In the early 19th century, immigrants from the Italian countryside settled in central London. As with all movements of people, they came looking for a better way of life and the prospects of wealth. For many of them, it was a chance to escape from the poverty trap of too many mouths to feed from too small an acreage of land. These immigrants were drawn to an area of Clerkenwell. Here they built their church, St Peter's Italian church. Why they chose Clerkenwell originally, we will never know – perhaps the first successful immigrants had found a welcome or a job and others just followed – who knows?

Saffron Hill begins in 1872 with a family of early Italian immigrants fleeing poverty and grief to make a new life in London. Will they find a welcome or a job, or will life take a different turn?


Saffron Hill is a new play in three acts by Penny Culliford that follows the lives and fortunes of generations of a fictional family in Saffron Hill, Clerkenwell from the 1870s to the 1960s. The play explores, through the eyes of this family, the issues, attitudes and music of the times. Although based around historical events, these stories represent the personal lives, loves and losses of Italian immigrant families living in the area.

Saffron Hill was written to commemorate the 150th Anniversary in 2014 of The Mazzini Garibaldi Club in 2014 in and the 150th Anniversary of Giuseppe Garibaldi's visit to London in 1864, as well as the 75th Anniversary of the sinking of the Arandora Star on the 2nd July 2015. Pepato, in a new adaptation by Penny Culliford, toured London and Rome in 2008-2009. Amongst other bilingual poetry and music evenings, performances and children's entertainment sessions, a new Bolivian play at The King's Head theatre in 2010 was followed by an English/Italian commedia inspired play, The Golden Chain/La Catena d'Oro at the Theatro Technis theatre in 2012. The Mazzini Garibaldi Foundation was set up and registered with the Charity Commission in June 2008 following the sale of the Mazzini Garibaldi Club premises at 52 Red Lion Street, London. The charitable objects of the Foundation are to assist the Italian community resident in the United Kingdom through the provision of financial support for those in need and to promote education and Italian culture. Nadia is especially grateful for the ongoing support from the Mazzini Garibaldi Club and Charitable Foundation as well as from the staff at Casa Italiana San Vincenzo Pallotti next door to St Peters Italian Church.

The Mazzini Garibaldi Club Limited dates its origins to the arrival of Giuseppe Mazzini in London and the visit of Giuseppe Garibaldi to the United Kingdom, and the Risorgimento. The Club was registered as a Friendly Society with the Italian Embassy, the Italian Consulate, St Peter's Italian Church, The Italian Hospital, The Scalabrini Centre and many Italian associations both in the United Kingdom and Italy. It has raised funds for Great Ormond Street Children's Hospital, St Peter's Italian Church, the Earthquake Fund (in 1995) as well as other worthy causes.

For many years the Club was an important focal point for many Italians in London who had recently arrived into the country, and who needed help to find employment, accommodation and a social base.

The current Mazzini Garibaldi Committee is working to ensure the role of the Italian Community in London and the historical origins and traditions of the Club are not forgotten and the sense of community is retained for the continued benefit of members and friends alike.
